Dear Mr. Ondrej Jombík,

Thank you for your letter dated 28 February 2017 regarding the .sk top-level domain's operation and management.

The Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN) does not set registration or management policies for country code top-level domains (ccTLDs). While policy for generic top-level domains such as .com and .info is managed through ICANN's global policy framework, policy for ccTLDs is based on the principle of subsidiarity. Registry operators are appointed within the country, under local laws, in conjunction with the local Internet community and local government. We have no power to be involved in how these operations are conducted.

We suggest that you reach out to the designated ccTLD manager to seek their insight on the issues listed in your letter. A list of all delegated ccTLDs and their managers is available here:
